Concert Band

-The Concert Band performs throughout the year at many school and local events as well as putting on 3 concerts per year on campus. There is a Spring Tour planned each year around Spring Break.

-All students in the IMD participate in Pep Band which includes all of the home football games, pep rallies, community events, and local parades.

-Meets during 1st period all year (7:00-8:00am).

-All students must be enrolled in Concert Band or Wind Ensemble to be eligible for participation in any other group (Marching Band, Jazz Band, or Percussion Ensemble)



Wind Ensemble Honors

-The Wind Ensemble is an advanced level Concert Band with admission into the group only by audition. This group has many of the same performance demands as the Concert Band (performs throughout the year at many school and local events as well as putting on 3 concerts per year on campus) as well as participating in an annual Spring Tour planned each year around Spring Break.

-Enrollment in this class is primarily Juniors and Seniors, although many sophomores are admitted depending on availability in their class schedule. Sophomores interested in auditioning for Wind Ensemble are encouraged to work ahead with their counselor to plan their academic schedule to allow a rotating class during 4th period.

-Meets on “B” days during 4th period all year (12:30-2:05).



Jazz Band

-There are two Jazz Bands at NPHS. Jazz I is for advanced players with strong individual musicianship (sight reading, playing, improvisation). Jazz II is for younger players that are interested in developing their skills and learning more about the Jazz tradition.

-Jazz Band meets Mon.-Thur. from 2:20-3:45pm. Students are enrolled in one of the Per. 5 Jazz Ensemble courses during the Spring.

-Placement in Jazz I is by audition, usually after Thanksgiving or early December.

-There are regular rehearsals and performances outside of the normal school day (before/after school, evenings, Saturdays).



Marching Band

-The Marching Band rehearses after school Mon-Thurs from 2:30-5:00pm in the fall. Students are enrolled in the Marching Band course during the Fall term and fulfill half of their P.E. requirement.

-There are two summer camps to prepare for Marching Band:

Band Camp I is in June (Mon. and Tues. the week after graduation)

Band Camp II is the week before the first day of school (M-F 8am-5pm)

-Additional Rehearsals and Performances are typically on Friday evenings or Saturdays.

-The Marching Band season typically runs from Band Camp in August until the weekend before Thanksgiving each year.



Percussion Ensemble

-All percussion students in either Concert Band or Wind Ensemble must participate in the percussion ensemble program. Rehearsals generally take place during the Concert Band classes.

-The Percussion Ensemble program is designed to help students develop fluency in all major phases of percussion performance (snare drum, timpani, mallets, auxiliary percussion instruments) through a series of leveled instrument etudes, playing tests, and ensemble performance.



Colorguard

-The Colorguard is a visual/dance unit that performs with the Marching Band in the fall. Students are enrolled in the Marching Band class in the fall term and fulfill half of their P.E. requirement through participation.

-No previous dance or colorguard experience is necessary. If you are interested, we'll teach you what you need to know.

-Additional rehearsals and performances are typically the same as the Marching Band.



Beginning Instruments

-This is a one semester class that is for any student who would like to learn how to play a band instrument (Flute, Clarinet, Oboe, Bassoon, Saxophone, Trumpet, Trombone, Tuba, Percussion).

-Students are taught the fundamentals of reading music, music theory, and how to play their instrument with a great sound.

-Students are generally very well prepared with a good foundation to participate in any of the band classes after they complete Beginning Instruments. Many of the students that have started in this class have gone on to audition successfully for the Wind Ensemble class the following year. It's all about individual effort!

Why does the band need more money?

Don't my taxes already pay for the band program?

Yes and no.....but mostly no.

What is provided by the state and school district covers the basic cost of offering the class without regard to any additional activities. Essentially, we get enough to teach just the class period and a modest amount from the district to help offset some of the costs of photocopies, purchasing some music, and additional staffing (music specialists that work with the kids).

As a music program, we are essentially on our own to provide for any other additional needs to enrich the students music education, including purchasing additional instruments, taking trips to festivals and competitions, providing meals to the students while we are away, purchasing quality literature and music resources to augment the curriculum.

Annual Financial Commitment

These donations are requested from every member of the Instrumental Music Department at the beginning of each year regardless of how many or what groups you are participating in.

1. CVUSD Transportation Fee \$124

An annual fee collected by the school district from every student that participates in a sport or activity to cover the cost of transportation to competitions .

2. Uniform Maintenance \$100

Collected to build and maintain a fund for the eventual replacement of marching band uniforms and concert apparel (tuxedos and dresses) provided to students on a loaner basis each year.

3. IMD Annual Pledge \$150

The IMD Annual Pledge is an annual donation requested of all band students that helps to fund on-going operational costs such as: instrument repair, purchasing music, providing additional coaching for the students with accomplished professional musicians as well as performances with special guest artists or teachers.

Total Requested Donation: \$374
